Advocacy

With the high lake levels, the increase in visitors has raised concerns about traffic speed, litter and rubbish dumping and lack of telecommunications around the area.

Greater control of weeds and a reduction in the number of dead trees on the lake bed are also high priority.

The community is keen to work with Council and land managers to lobby for these improvements.
