Advocacy

There are some improvements that we would like to see that will require community support to advocate for changes to be made.

We commit to working together and with Council to advocate for:

- Improvements to non-existent wireless telecommunications which we see as one of the highest priorities for our area.
- Retain the physical character of the area, particularly in regards to weed control
- Roads and drains advocate for improvements of road surfaces, drainage and management of dangerous, overhanging trees

Why: It is a high priority to move the bus stop from the main road into a safer location in the village. Combining the bus stop, post boxes and noticeboard all in the one location would create a great community hub. These projects are listed in no particular order.

Sail away

What: Create an area to launch boats in Macs Cove.

Why: The most popular activity of Howqua & Macs Cove residents is fishing and many families spend time on the lake in summer so a local boat launch area would be well used. Once the launch itself is complete, future community plans can look at possible future development of a park area.

In the know

What: Noticeboard for Howqua.

Why: The residents of Howqua would like a noticeboard to enable them to communicate with each other, keep in touch with what's going on and display the map/s that are listed in this plan

A space to call our own

What: Create a playground/BBQ area in or near Howqua Inlet

Why: We'd like a space to call our own, somewhere to relax, have picnics and BBQ's and watch the children play.
