1. Customer Service

Monthly Customer Request Management System (CRMS) Report – November 2022

CRMS statistics for the month of November show 187 customer requests registered with 71 requests remaining open and 116 being closed during the month.

Two complaints were received for November:

1. An expression of dissatisfaction with council decision, a resident was not content with decision/advise from Engineering regarding his crossover works.

Resolution: The resident was unhappy with the requirement to pay the legislated fee required to process his application for a works in road reserve permit. Council officers are in contact with the resident to explain the requirements.

2. An expression of dissatisfaction with council's service provision, with the Planning Department regarding permit conditions and ongoing delays.

Resolution: Council officers have met with the permit holder and worked to resolve outstanding requirements with the required plans.

The majority (54%) of total requests opened were for Road Maintenance (Field Services). Road Maintenance (Field Services) requests consisted of (in order of frequency):

Potholes

Roads Corrugation

• Drainage

- Limb/Tree Removal
- Weeds and Vegetation

Parks and Garden Services (17%) was the second largest group. Parks and Garden Services requests consisted of (in order of frequency) these are requests that were submitted by the Website:

Financial Counselling

Mansfield Shire's Financial Counsellor is often asked to present for community groups. This month they presented to the Anglican Church's Night Owls Group – 14 women attended & enjoyed an information session and Q&A on what a Financial Counsellor does.

A successful youth financial literacy workshop was held at the Youth Centre on 21 November. Young people aged 18 – 24 years attended this workshop with a focus on "How much does it cost to buy a \$5,000 car?".

The presentation was well received by the 3 young people (& 2 staff) who attended. The Coordinator Youth Program provided each participant with a copy of Scott Pape's latest book, "Barefoot Kids: Your Epic Money Adventure".

There are plans for more workshops to be held in 2023.

Youth Services

The Youth Program provided two workshops on Financial literacy this month. Facilitated by Mansfield Shire Council's Financial Counsellor Several young people attended either the 18-25 years workshop or a 12-17 years' workshop and participants received a copy of Scott Pape's latest book, "Barefoot Kids: Your Epic Money Adventure".

Youth attended Mansfield Secondary College's Breakfast club and held our first Freeza Committee meeting under the new Youth Program at the Youth Centre. Staff attended YDAS training on inclusive practices for young people.

Integrated Family Services

In November Integrated Family Services continued to support 14 families. We continue to work alongside Child Protection and our Ovens Murray Alliance partners such as The Orange Door during these challenging times to provide families with the support that they require.

Health and Quality

- Mansfield Better Communities for Children Network meeting held 9 November 2022, an agenda planner has been developed and proposed dates provided for feedback by the network.
- Early Years Educators Network meeting set for Tuesday 6 December opportunity to bring the network back together and discuss the important issues facing the early years sector.
- Youth Service Providers Network First network meeting was held on 30 November with attendance of youth service providers, school representatives and council representatives. Discussions were positive and topics are being identified as a focus for the network for 2023 to create an agenda planner.
- Magda's Big Health Check the final episode of the series aired on 15 November 2022 with a focus on mental health and food. Positive responses and feedback have been received when speaking with the community about the documentary series. To keep the conversation going Respond, Mansfield Shire Council Officer Health and Quality and local medical clinics will be hosting Heart Health Checks on Saturday 10 December 2022 at both the Botanic Park and in the High St median strip.




The Great Victorian Rail Trail (GVRT)

November saw a decrease year on year with 2021. There were a loss of 1171 riders through Mansfield, 983 through Bonnie Doon and 438 at Merton. We did have to take our readings a little early this month due to staff availabilities so this may have impacted a little bit, it should even out next month.

The weather continues to be our greatest hindrance to numbers with heavy rain in November impacting trail usage yet again.



- The Great ARTdoors update Taungurung Artist Mick Harding who is doing the trail long project has started his scarred trees. He has four to five in our shire and has currently completely three.
- The new water fountain at the start of the GVRT has now been installed and commissioned. The Friends of the Rail Trail group are very happy after seven years of campaigning for one.
- The recent storms and rain caused a lot of maintenance on the trail and the Field Services team have been very busy responding to damage reports and general maintenance for the trail.

Visitor Survey

The Visitor Information Staff have recommenced gathering information from visitors to the centre. Looking at age ranges, origin of travel, reasons for travel and more. These figures have remained consistent throughout the survey's current lifespan.

37% of visitors were aged 60+

58% of visitors to the VIC were visiting Mansfield for their first time

The most popular reason for visiting the Information Centre was for Maps and directions followed by road conditions and updates. With the significant rain and tracks reopening soon there has been a large increase in trail, 4wd track condition reports. Food and wine enquiries also jumped a bit which is great to see.

Events

Goughs Bay Festival – Saturday November 19

Worked with the Goughs Bay Area Progress Association and the Goughs Bay Boat Club to present a foreshore festival; alongside a Ramsay boat display and Mansfield Car Club show, council hosted a range of market stalls, food carts and live music. There were also kids activities such as jumping castle and a craft corner to make your own tote bag to take home.

Numbers were strong in the morning which was great to see and then as rain came in around lunchtime numbers slowly dropped off leading into heavier rain around 2pm.

Feedback from the groups, community and visitors was great and they were happy to see the event wasn't cancelled and pushed on.

Farmers Market Relocation – November 26

Again, due to rain we assisted with relocation of the Farmers Market to the carpark in between the CFA and Mansfield hotel.

Christmas Windows and Scavenger Hunt

Teaming up with Mansfield Community Bank and Mansfield District Business Association, Council helped develop the scavenger hunt marketing collateral for this annual event.

Business Contacts

Council's Economic Development Officer Business Support continues to engage local businesses with visits and calls. Most engagements have included discussions around funding and grant opportunities, training and ongoing support programs. Through November 29 businesses were visited.

Business Supports

Council continues to provide support to the Mansfield District Business Association in facilitating the provision of further virtual and face to face business training workshops, support and advice sessions for local business with Business Victoria in partnership with Monarch Institute.

Businesses can directly book training sessions online via the Mansfield Shire Council "Business Matters" Newsletter and this offers online training sessions and the opportunity for face-to-face training utilising Mansfield Shire Council facilities to conduct the booked sessions.

Better Approvals

Businesses sought assistance to vary product/services through change, expansion or creation of new entities.

- Enquiry regarding interest in becoming a licensed firearm dealer and any council approvals.
- Enquiry regarding the potential development of a small light industrial area.
- Enquiry for permit requirements for a new gymnasium and physiotherapy business.
- Enquiry regarding office space for psychologist/ well-being consulting rooms.

GOTAFE Mobile Campus

The GOTAFE Mobile Campus will return to Mansfield for 6 to 8 December. Visits are gradually growing user visitation, and we are keen to maintain the momentum.

Business Victoria – Small Business Bus

The Business Victoria – "Small Business Bus" – visited Mansfield 18 November and while appointment uptake was low, walk-up enquiry kept the staff engaged. Promotion for this visit

utilised the Business Newsletter, MDBA promotion and targeted email marketing and social media promotion.

TELSTRA Mobile Shop

Telstra's November visit was again successful with plenty of enquiry, assistance and requests for their return and so they will be back for 24 November. We are currently trying to schedule a December visit.

Business Events Victoria – Workshop

Council facilitated the Business Events Victoria Workshop on 10 November funded through Business Victoria (DJPR). The workshop was held at Sebel Pinnacle with 10 attendees. The workshops covered events and clients, marketing, engagement, sales tips and techniques and collaborating/ cooperation. Follow up enquiry to Business Events Victoria (BEV) has been positive seeking further advice on gaining positions to the BEV website.

Library

Refurbishment Update – November

- Stage 1 of the building work has been completed.
- A removalist has been secured to move and store the books. This will take place between Christmas and New Year. The Library will be closed between Tuesday 21 December and Saturday 7 January, allowing time for everything to be packed up and stored OR moved to the Visitors Information Centre.
- A floorplan and work plan is being developed for the limited Library service at the VIC.
- We have been revisiting shelving requirements and considering whether it is financially viable to reuse some of the shelving components currently in use.
- Working with the High Country Library Network and SyrsiDynix to update the Library Management System to reflect changes in access to, and management of, the collection during the period of closure and the limited service at the VIC.

Preschool Storytime has moved from the Drama Room at the Sports Complex to the Youth Centre. This is a much more comfortable and inviting space for young children and their parents.

A Christmas extravaganza is being organised for early December with a visit from Santa and local musicians.

Library Sector

Public Libraries Victoria Network have reported that the temporary interruption to the loan service due to problems with the State-wide courier service should be resolved by March next year. As a result, borrowers will again be able to access items outside the High Country Library Network.



- Telstra mobile shop being in town 3,527



Council's Website


Council's website has attracted over 5.6K visitors throughout November resulting in over 18.5k page views. Each visitation session averaged 2 minutes.

Predominantly, the visitation has resulted from an organic google search or direct access to the page, followed by social media.




Engage Portal
