## 1. Customer Service

### Monthly Customer Request Management System (CRMS) Report – October 2022

CRMS statistics for the month of October show 263 customer requests registered with 104 requests remaining open and 159 being closed during the month.

One complaint was received for October:

 A cemeteries client complained that Council had not provided the service of refurbishment of a plaque. Resolution: An investigation into service provision relating to cemeteries has been undertaken and measures put into place to ensure that the requirements of the Customer Service Charter are met going forward. The customer has been contacted and this specific issued resolved.

The majority (49%) of total requests opened were for Road Maintenance (Field Services). Road Maintenance (Field Services) requests consisted of (in order of frequency):

Potholes

Roads Corrugation

Drainage

- Limb/Tree Removal
- Weeds And Vegetation.







#### Debtors






#### **Payment of Rates**


Rates and charges for 2022-23 were issued 1 September with the first instalment due 30 September 2022. By 31 October, the cut-off date for raising valuation objections with the Valuer General, council had received 55 objections – previous year was only 14.

Rates Arrears has decreased from 3.9% in August to 2.9% in September and then to 2.7% in October. The second rates instalment notice will be issued in early November with payment due date by the 30 November 2022, with an associated expected increase in this rate for the next report.





The number of property assessments accessing hardship arrangements had a slight decrease in October.




### **Property sales data**

The number of Land Information Certificates (LICs) processed annually and year to date are shown below. LIC's are required to be provided by Council to property conveyancers to assist in calculating property settlement payments in relation to Council rates and charges outstanding against a property being bought/sold.

The volume of LIC's processed can provide an indicator of the buoyancy of the property market. The Mansfield Shire saw a slowing down in the property market in 2021-22. For 2022-23 the market has remained stable with a slight increase in October, in line with sale's peak periods.









### **Integrated Family Services**

In October Integrated Family Services continued to support 14 families dealing with issues ranging from grief and loss, serious mental illness, family violence, childhood behaviours and the impacts of trauma. The service system in which we work is still being affected by staff shortages and illness, making the usual referral pathways for families even more problematic than usual.

We continue to work alongside Child Protection and our Ovens Murray Alliance partners such as The Orange Door during these challenging times to provide families with the support that they require.

### Health and Quality

**Mansfield Better Communities for Children Network** meeting – Network meeting held on Wednesday 9 November. Survey responses received and collated to develop a schedule of topics for the 2023 agenda.

**Early Years Educators Network** meeting set for Tuesday 6 December – opportunity to bring the network back together and discuss the important issues facing the early years sector.

**Youth Service Providers Network** – meeting set for 30 November 2022, the network to ne invigorated and revamped to support our young people in Mansfield

**Magda's Big Health Check -** episode 2 of the 3-part series aired on 8 November 2022, with the focus of this episode around healthy eating and focus on checking food labels for ultra-processed food. The Respond initiative that appeared in this episode was the soup for schools program, in which the secondary college prepared the soup for the primary school students. Episode 3 to air on Tuesday 15 November 2022 – 8.30pm on ABC and iView

**Vic Kids Eat Well** – Continuing to work with sporting clubs and schools to promote the program and assist with establishing a baseline and focus for areas of improvement.

### **Aged Care**

Seniors' week celebrations offered any residents over 60 years the ability to participate in a range of free activities such as Pilates, Bushwalks, Art classes and Yoga.

We supported Rosehaven with a contribution to their Cinema event and supported the Friends of the Library with the Mad Hatter's Tea party.

The Seniors Ball at the Golf Club was a hit with 60 attendees enjoying live music and a twocourse dinner for \$10 per person subsidised by the Senior Festival Grant.

We are entering the final stages of this project by




### The Great Victorian Rail Trail (GVRT)

Wet weather across the month of October saw a decrease in users of the trail, which is not surprising. 13 days of rain were recorded over the month with a lot of water remaining on the trail outside of these days which impacted usage.

The Field Services team have been dealing with branches down across the trail throughout the month and are scheduling full trail clearance maintenance for November.

- Mitchell, Murrindindi and Mansfield received a response from TNE in regard to the great ARTdoors project and following review are looking at alternative options to promote this project.



### Mansfield Visitor Information Centre (VIC)

The VIC has seen a decrease on last month which is understandable with the flooding in the North East region.

October was an interesting month for the Visitor Information Centre with a decline of 237 walk in visitors to the centre when compared to September. A few reasons for this are the end of the snow season seeing a reduction in visitors, alongside the flooding throughout the region and roads being closed to the area.

An increase in phone calls to the centre was also recorded with people ringing to check road conditions and access.

### **Visitor Survey**

The Visitor Information Staff are gathering information from visitors to the centre. Looking at age ranges, origin of travel, reasons for travel and more. These figures have remained consistent throughout the surveys current lifespan.

35% of visitors were aged 60+

**30%** of visitors were aged 40 - 60

25% of visitors were aged 18 - 40

45% were adult couples

76% of visitors were here for a holiday over one day with 32% staying 2 nights

58% of visitors to the VIC were visiting Mansfield for their first time

Most popular things were in order -

- Rivers, lakes and water.
- Bushwalking & outdoors.
- Mount Buller.
- Attractions.

The most popular reason for visiting the information centre was for Maps and directions followed by road conditions and updates. With the significant rain and tracks reopening soon there has been a large increase in trail, 4wd track condition reports.

Council has submitted further information around our sporting facilities and ability to host teams prior to the games for practice and training.

### **Events**

### Mountain Cattlemen's Annual Get Together – Fri 30 Sep – Sun 2 Oct

Council worked with the Cattlemen's committee to ensure a safe event was delivered with respect to weather and road conditions. Ensuring camping sites were properly monitored and vehicles safely secured in parking. Council assisted with road conditions for the diversion of traffic down Buttercup Rd.

### Seniors Week – Sun 2 Oct – Sun 9 Oct

Council organised a range of events for Seniors Week using local business to deliver things such as yoga, Pilates, bushwalks, movies, painting and a senior's ball. The Ball was attended by 60 guests at a subsidised rate of \$10 per head. The whole week was fully booked out and received great feedback from the community.

### 150 years Mansfield Primary School Fair – Sat 8 Oct

Council supported this school event with a range of equipment from fencing, umbrellas, sanitiser stations to marquees and sandbags. We also helped to co-ordinate food vendors. It was a great day and attendance was high.

### Mansfield Mens Shed Open Day – Saturday 15 October

Council assisted with the setup of the men's shed open day supplying fencing for the front of the shed and umbrellas for shade. It looked great and they were very thankful.

#### RACV Alpine Centenary – Thu 20 Oct – Fri 21 Oct

Council welcomed the RACV Alpine Centenary car trials through town. Working with local caterers to set up a dinner on Thursday night and a breakfast on Friday morning at the St Marys Hall. We had to cancel the show 'n shine event due to weather but were able to move this somewhat to the Friday morning breakfast. Feedback was fantastic from the RACV group who really enjoyed their time in Mansfield and look forward to returning.

#### Mansfield Independence Anniversary Celebration – Sat 22 Oct

Council along with the Independence Committee organised a celebration of 20 years since we de-amalgamated from Delatite Shire. Originally planned to be at the Botanic Park the celebrations were moved to the council chambers. Over 50 guests heard from Mayor James Tehan, Don Cummins and Will Twycross talk about the process and the importance of it. A great success with higher than expected numbers and community involvement.

#### Mansfield Steiner School Spring Fair & Open Day – Sat 22 Oct

Council provided a range of marquees to assist with a wet weather program for the Steiner School open day and fair.

### Mansfield Farmers Market – Sat 22 Oct

Council assisted with moving the Mansfield Farmers Market to a new location due to sodden grounds across from the post office. Moving to the carpark in between the Mansfield Hotel and the Courthouse. Council provided barriers and a last-minute permit to allow this to occur safely.

### Mercedes Benz G Wagen Show N Shine – Sat 28 Oct – Sun 29 Oct

Council organised the Visitor Information Centre carpark for the largest gathering of Mercedes G Wagens in Victoria to occur. Over 36 vehicles on display for Saturday and Sunday morning with catering organised for Sunday for a breakfast for the club. The VIC provided showbags detailing attractions for the group to explore in the afternoons. Feedback was great and the club was very impressed with how we accommodated them around a difficult weekend with weather and suppliers.

#### Mansfield High Country Festival – Friday 28 Oct – Tue 1 Nov - Cancelled

Another casualty of the continuing rain, the Mansfield High Country Festival occurred over the weekend in a dramatically reduced format. Late in the week, Mansfield Shire Council had the undesirable task of making the call on multiple key elements of the weekend with impending weather and current conditions.

Due to site conditions and impending weather, cancellations were made including the Friday night opening festival, FReeZA concert, fireworks, breakfast on the lawn and the Emergency Services Torchlight Parade. On Saturday the ever-popular Bush Market could not be held on Highett St, the Grand Parade sites were too unsafe to go ahead and the new Amped Up! Amphitheatre Sound Sessions also fell victim to the ground conditions. Council worked with the Bush Market Committee to pull together the 'Mansfield Mini Market' for local stallholders on Saturday which was well attended and deemed a success by stallholders. The North East Skate Park Series was cancelled for Sunday with wet weather predicted and staff travelling from 3 hours away, however the sun shone all day on what could have been.

### **Flood Data**

Council has surveyed 17 accommodation providers in regard to the long weekend weather and impact on their business, this has been sent to TNE to form some data for possible flood support.

### **Business Contacts**

Council's Economic Development Officer Business Support continues to engage local businesses with visits and calls. Most engagements have included discussions around funding and grant opportunities, training or ongoing support programs. Through October 32 businesses were provided with direct engagement visits.

#### **Business Support**

Council is providing ongoing support to the Mansfield District Business Association in facilitating further virtual and face to face business training workshops, support and advice sessions for local business with Business Victoria in partnership with Monarch Institute.

Businesses can directly book training sessions online via the Mansfield Shire Council "Business Matters" Newsletter and this offers online training sessions and the opportunity for face-to-face training utilising Mansfield Shire Council facilities to conduct the booked sessions.

#### **Better Approvals**

Businesses sought assistance to vary product/services through change, expansion or creation of new entities.

A local re-visioned Hotel/ Restaurant and now launched Brewing/ Function/ Hotel.

Continued support to assist Kevington Hotel with event potential and business mentoring/ support via Small Business Mentoring Services.

### **GOTAFE Mobile Campus**

The Mobile Campus visit for October was a cancelled casualty of rain events. It was invited and re-scheduled to participate in the Grand Parade during the High Country Festival Opening, that was eventually cancelled. Ongoing discussions with GOTAFE eventually allowed Council to re-engage a visit from the Mobile Campus for 6 to 8 December. Each visit has resulted in increased visitation, and we are keen to maintain the momentum.

### **Business Victoria – Small Business Bus**

The Business Victoria – "Small Business Bus" - will be in Mansfield for 18 November and will be located within the Car Parking Area in Highett Street (South) between the Mansfield Hotel and the Courthouse.

#### **TELSTRA Mobile Shop**

Telstra's October visit was successful with plenty of enquiry, assistance and requests for their return and so they will be back for 24 November. We are currently scheduling a December visit.

### Library

### **Refurbishment Update – October**

- Building work continues the extension to the north-west corner of the library.

#### Exhibition of artwork by young Mansfield artists

A temporary wall has been transformed into an exhibition space for young Mansfield artists.

The 9m temporary wall is obscuring large areas of window. We wanted to offer the public something special to make up for the lack of natural light.

The 72 entries into the Children's Book Week bookmark competition are now on display.

The quality of the artwork and diversity of imaginative responses to the theme 'Dreaming with eyes open...' is spectacular. Terrific feedback has been received so far, and children are excited to seek out their own bookmark amongst the display.



### **Library Sector**

The Library is currently unable to fulfil holds from libraries outside the High Country Library Network. This is due to a temporary interruption to the loan service as Library services across Victoria move to a new State-wide Courier service. The transition will take place over the next few weeks.

The majority of borrowers are not greatly affected by this interruption, as the 127,000 items in the High Country Library Network collection remain available for loan. However, there are a small number of borrowers with specific borrowing requirements that are significantly limited.


### **Council's Website**


Council's website has attracted over 8.4k users throughout October which is up by 41.8% over the September period. This equates to an average of 154 visits per day throughout October with a total of almost 23k page views recorded. Each visit resulted in an average of 2 pages being viewed.

The Events Update providing details of the High Country Festival revised event schedule which was published on 25 October received over 1,000 visits.

It's evident from the community response to social media and website visitation in relation to the High Country Festival cancellations that this annual festival continues to be highly valued by our community who are greatly invested in this community event.

Generally, most visits originate from an organic search however, Council's social media drove the visitation on 25 October as a result of the event cancellation as highlighted in the graph below.





Over 60% of visits were viewed on a mobile device (up 65% on the last period), 35% from a desktop computer (up 13%) and 4% from a tablet (up 85%).


