- The Castle2 The musical production of 'The Castle2' directed by Dr. Will Twycross was the talk of the town with every show played to a sold out audience. It saw around 150 members of the community come together through 5 months of rehearsals and saw new friendships formed and old friends reconnect. The show was enjoyed by all who were fortunate enough to see it providing an evening of entertainment, laughter, singing and great music. Congratulations to everyone that was involved in putting this wonderful show together, it is sure to be one remembered for years to come.
- Klytie Pate Ceramics Award The Klytie Pate Ceramics Award is a highly regarded National art prize and an exceptional exhibition showcasing the works of talented artists from across Australia and New Zealand. The strategic marketing campaign resulted in more than 150 entries and brought in excess of 300 visitors specifically to Mansfield for the exhibition.
- Horsepower in the High Country The Horsepower in the High Country 2023 event, recently crowned the winner of the Best Charity or Cause Related Event for Victoria at the Australian Event Awards, showcased approximately 250 motor vehicles, including classic, vintage, modern, motorcycles, race cars and speedboats. The day attracted thousands of people, both locals and those visiting the region, and saw \$8,000 raised for Mansfield Autism Statewide Services.
- Battle of the Bands This event provided a great opportunity for young people to share their passion and talent for music in a friendly and safe space and made everyone feel like they achieved something even if they didn't win.
- Mansfield Open Studio Train (M.O.S.T.) This year's M.O.S.T event was again a huge success and showcased the crafts of many of our local artists. Since inception, the number of exhibitors and participants has continued to grow which demonstrates that good marketing and word of mouth is golden when attracting visitors to our Shire. This event provided a very entertaining day out for all those who attended.



Community Group of Organisation of the Year – Delatite Drivers Car Club
