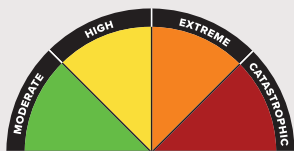
Mansfield Shire

Tolmie's Local Emergency Action Plan has been developed by the community for the community. Key actions have been identified to increase the knowledge, skills and resilience of the community during times of an emergency.

Tolmie is located 20 km north-east of Mansfield. It is situated in heavily forested and mountainous terrain. The main hazards identified by the community include bushfires, windstorms, accidents, roads blocked by debris, and animals (wildlife and livestock).
